GOOD NEWS! The lake is on the rise! At least a little bit - about 3 to 4 inches. The rains of the resent two weeks have helped. The predicted hot, dry summer, however, will not help. So, let's all be extra careful to eliminate beach litter, to stop use of fertilizers as much as possible, to protect for erosion of sand and pollutants into the lake, and to control spitting in the lake - it doesn't raise the water level measurably!

TRUSTEES, OFFICERS, COMMITTEES met on Saturday, May 27 at 11:00 A.M. We had a lot of coffee, many good cookies, and considerable discussion. Important matters were:

1. Ginger Frick, our treasurer, reported \$616.52 on hand as of 5/27/00.

2. Bob Stegmier and Clarence Nordquist, our fishy - I mean "fish" committee recommended no fish planting this year. They also recommended that no new brush piles be established because of low water level.

3. The trustees remind all owners of dogs to keep them - the dogs, that is - under control, especially when children are playing on the beach

or walking around the lake.

4. The trustees recommend that a buffer zone of plants and grasses be established between the bank and the shoreline to help control erosion. Ahighly recommended plant is called "Switch Crass". If you are interested, give Bob Stegmier a phone call at (231) 898-3002 (Gifford Lake) or (616) 866-4769 (Rockford, Mi). He knows where you can get seeds.

SPRING NEWSLETTER - April 7, 2000

Greeting from your "prez" at wonderful Gifford Lake!

First: A short summary of the September 4, 1999 meeting of your Trustees and officers; N. Trustee- George Stegmeir, E. Trustee - Terry Couturier, W. Trustee - Henry Tjoelker; Fish Committee: Bob Stegmier and Clarence Nordquist; Picnic Committee: Larry and Carol Sinke and John and Nancy Barrows; Treasurer: Ginger Frick; Secretary: Marge Doorn, and yours truly were in attendance. Wow, what a handsome group that was!

Our treasurer, Ginger, reported a balance of \$255.16 in the "coffers". That is a little short! A whole bunch of you haven't paid dues for a year or more. They are a bargain for only \$15.00. A little notice is included with this newsletter if you haven't paid lately. If you have, thanks a lot. In these prosperous times, all of us can afford to pay!

Fish committee persons, Bob and Clarence, recommended that no fish be planted in 2000. The trustees agreed.

Annual Gifford Lake Picnic will be held on July 2, 2000 at the George Stegmier Beach, beginning at 1:00 P.M. Details will be sent to you in an early June newsletter.

Concern was expressed regarding beach erosion. I'll write about this in a minute! That is all from the Officers - Trustees meeting.

Second: Erosion can be a serious problem for lakes and streams. May I suggest that you inspect your lakeside bank and beach for erosion. A good time to do this is immediately following a rainstorm. If sand and forest debris is washing toward the lake, pollutants contained in them will likely enter the lake directly. How do you control this? Some ways include letting the beach grass grow, installing landscape timbers and/or rocks at the base of the banks, letting trees and bushes grow on the banks, and not removing old stumps. Thanks!

Third: Regarding the Gypsy Moth problem. I have been looking carefully for egg sacks in trees and crevices for a number of months, and have found only a few. Michigan State Extension Service personnel indicated to me that the problem will be spotty, but probably not serious. So I'm suggesting that we do not spray this year. I personally, do not like to spray anything that may unintentionally harm wildlife. If the gypsy moths do eat us up, you can impeach me!

And Last: The winter was beautiful with a good snow and ice cover until
the end of February. Then it all melted! There has been little rain
or snow since. It looks like the spring fire-hazard will be high, so
be careful. The lake level is very low(we came in 1968 and I have
never seen it this low) so let's all be extremely careful of the lake.
Please don't start any new fish cover brush piles. It will probably
be OK to renew some old ones if needed.
